

COLLEGE PROFILE

Salbari College was established on 14th of November in 1983 by the conscious educationists and guardians of the locality with mere public donations amidst the poor socio-economic conditions prevailing at that time. They took the bold step of starting the first ever higher educational institution in the area for the benefit of the aspiring students of poor families in the greater Salbari area. They named it 'Salbari College' with a view to establishing the name of Salbari in the educational map of Assam through its contribution to the educational field. The college opened undergraduate courses under Gauhati University till 2022 and is currently under Bodoland University.

The beautiful campus of Salbari College is spread over 38 bighas and 17 lessas of land. The college has earned a remarkable reputation for teaching humanities for many years. It was registered under sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956, vide notification No. 8-371/2006 (CP), and obtained government concurrence and certified by AISHE (All India Survey of Higher Education).

The college has gloriously completed 4 decades since its inception and has developed computing facilities, Internet connectivity, an uninterrupted power supply system, digital library housing a gigantic collection of books and journals (more than sixteen thousand books and eleven weekly and monthly national and international journals), etc.

The College was brought under the purview of provincialization in 2013 under the "Assam Venture Education Institute Provincialization (Provincialization of Services) Acts 2011 and 2012, as amended. The college is located at Salbari, opposite to SDO (C) office, which is in the heart of Salbari Sub-Division in the District of Baksa (Eastwhile Barpeta) in the Bodoland Territorial Council of Assam and at the feet of World famous heritage site Manas National Park. It is about 10 km south of the Indo-Bhutan Border and 25 km to the north from the No. 31 National Highway. The college is also well connected by public transport. The nearest railway stations are Sarupeta, Pathsala, and Barpeta Road, which are 18 km, 20 km, and 30 km away from the college, respectively.





THE EMBLEM

The College has its own emblem which has its meaning and significance. The emblem is carved out of globe with an inner circle in it. The main abacus is coded within the circle. In the middle of the inner circle an earthen lamp is present signifying that education enlightens human being. The lightning is surrounded by the two full grown stalk of rice signifying the area, where the College is situated, comprises of peasant community.

Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

Important Terms in FYUGP Under Bodoland University

- **National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020):** The NEP 2020 embarked on liberal arts multidisciplinary education that aims to produce graduates with multiple knowledge and skills possessing integrated personalities. The policy envisions the undergraduate degree to be of either 3- or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit options within this period and with appropriate certifications.
- **Academic Year:** Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.
- **Semester:** Each semester will consist of 15 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. An academic year consists of two semesters. The odd semesters are to be scheduled from July to December, and even semesters from January to June.
- **Programme:** A programme, hereinafter, shall mean an academic programme leading to the award of a degree, diploma or certificate. It comprises a fixed set of Major (compulsory), Elective, Skill Enhancement, Value Added Courses and Internships wherever applicable with a minimum Credit requirement.
- **Course:** A course, usually referred to as 'paper', is a component of a Programme, comprising one or more combinations of lectures, tutorials, laboratory work, fieldwork, outreach activities, project work, vocational training, viva, seminars, term papers, assignments, presentations, self- study etc. or a combination of some of these.
- **Major Discipline:** Major Discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and a degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through courses in the discipline.
- **Minor Discipline:** Minor Discipline (may or may not be related to Major Discipline opted by the student) helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics then the student will be awarded B.A. Degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.
- **Multiple Entry and Exit Points:** These are stages where the students may have options for entry and exit in the academic programmes in Higher Education Institutions to be facilitated through the facility created by the Academic Bank of Credit scheme in the manner as provided in the UGC "Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions".
- **Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF):** It is a framework initiated by the UGC in 2018 for updating the CBCS curriculum to reflect the expected learning outcomes and academic standards that are expected to be attained by graduates of a programme of study and holders of a qualification.
- **Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS):** It is the system formulated by the UGC in 2015. The CBCS provides choices for students to select from the prescribed courses (Major, elective or minor or soft skill courses). Under the CBCS, the requirement for awarding a degree or diploma or certificate is prescribed in terms of a minimum number of credits to be completed by the students.
- **Academic Bank of Credit (ABC):** It is the platform developed by the National e-Governance Division (NeGD) of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India, having the facility/ functionality of opening Academic Accounts by students and onboarding of eligible Higher Education Institutions (HE is), by "The University Grants Commission (Establishment and Operation of Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education) Regulations, 2021". ABC will digitally store the academic credits earned by students from HE registered with ABC for awarding degrees/diplomas/certificates taking into account credits earned by students. ABC will ensure the opening, closure and validation of Academic Bank Accounts, credit verification, credit accumulation, and credit transfer, redemption for students.
- **Grade Point:** It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.
- **Letter Grade:** It is an index of the performance of students in a course. Grades are denoted by letters O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P, F and Ab.
- **Credit Point:** It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):** It is a measure of the performance of work done in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester to the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.

- **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):** It is a measure of the overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters to the sum of the total credits of all courses in all semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places.
- **Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate:** Based on the grades earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with the SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.
- **Major (MAJ) and Minor (MIN) Course:** All discipline-specific major and minor courses will carry 4 credits.
- **Ability Enhancement Course/ Skill Enhancement Courses:** The Ability Enhancement Course may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). AEC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement: (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English / MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on training, competencies, skills, etc. These may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge. Each of the AEC and SEC courses shall carry 2 and 3 Credits respectively.
- **Value Addition Courses (VAC):** These are courses that will help develop all capacities of human beings - intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner. It includes subjects like Yoga, Sports, Health Care, NCC, NSS, Ethics, Culture, etc. VAC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses. Each VAC course shall carry 04 Credits. The students may opt for any of the VAC courses from the pool of courses approved by the University.
- **Interdisciplinary Course (IDC):** It is to be opted from outside the major and minor courses. Each IDC shall carry 3 credits. The students may opt for any of the IDC courses from the pool of courses approved by the University with the condition that the course was not studied at the 10+2 level.
- **Dissertation/Project:** It is designed to acquire special/ advanced knowledge which is termed a dissertation/ project. This is considered a special course involving the application of knowledge in solving/ analyzing/ exploring a real-life situation / difficult problem. Dissertation / Project Work is optional and it may be offered in lieu of a discipline-specific elective paper in the 8th Semester.
- **Internship:** A student should undergo an internship course of 02 credits during 4th semester of his/her UG programme. However, if a student exits after 1st or 2nd year, he/she needs to undergo an additional internship programme having a 4 credit score along with the existing 2 credit score in Semester - IV. Institutions will sign MOU with nearby institutions/offices/Research Centre/Industries/NGOs/ Skill Training Centres etc. for the internship courses.
- There may be parallel five-year integrated Master's degree Programmes with exit options after each year with the Undergraduate Degree and Undergraduate Degree with Honours/ Research in a discipline, respectively.
- The curriculum combines conceptual knowledge with practical engagement and understanding that has relevant real-world application through practical laboratory work, fieldwork, internships, workshops and research projects.

Courses

■ First Year (Semesters I and II)

1. The courses offered in the first year will aim to develop an understanding of all Major areas of study such as Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, Humanities, Mathematical and Computational thinking and analysis, Creative expressions and Vocational education. The courses will be broad in scope and introductory in nature. In addition to these, students will also study the Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), Interdisciplinary Course (IDC) and Value-Added Course (VAC).
2. Change of Major: Affiliated Colleges may create additional 10% seats over and above the sanctioned intake capacity to accommodate the request for a change of Major in 3rd Semester or at the end of 1st year.

■ Second Year (Semester III and Semester IV)

1. The students will choose courses of their interest in Major and Minor. They will also study courses to strengthen their language (AEC), IDC and other skill augmenting course with hands- on training.



■ **Third Year (Semester V and Semester VI)**

1. Higher level courses on the chosen Major and Minor in the Disciplinary or Interdisciplinary areas of learning to gain in-depth knowledge.

■ **Fourth Year (Semester VII and Semester VIII)**

1. Advanced level of courses in Major/ Minor discipline along with Research Methodology for UG degree with Honours.
 2. For the Honours with Research UG degree, Course content will include advanced-level courses, research methodology and research projects.
 3. Students may be allowed to carry out a research project or dissertation in another department of the same institution or another institution equipped with the required facilities.
 4. For opting for a Research project/dissertation in Semester VIII, students must opt for a Research Methodology paper in Semester VII.
- Any student passing Higher Secondary/ H.S. (10+2)/ Senior Secondary examination or its equivalent from any recognized Board/ Council shall be eligible for admission by admission process conducted by Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam to the 1st Semester of the Under Graduate (B.A./ B. Sc./ B. Com/ B. Music) programme of studies subject to availability of seats. (Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating five years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).
 - For B.Sc./BPT, a candidate who has passed 10+2 with Science or equivalent shall be eligible for Admission. A candidate opting for life science subjects like Botany, Zoology, Biotechnology, Home Science, etc, as Major Subjects in the B.Sc. The programme must have passed Physics, Chemistry, and Biology as prerequisite subjects at the qualifying examination. A candidate opting for subjects like Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics as Major Subjects in the B.Sc. The programme must have passed Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics as prerequisite subjects at the qualifying examination.
 - All admission processes to First Semester in the Salbari Colleges shall be completed according to the Academic Calendar of each Academic year. In the case of other Semesters, provisional admission to subsequent Semester classes is completed within 15 days from the date of completion of the previous Semester's examination.
 - A student shall be allowed to change a subject(s)/stream within 30 days of his/ her admission to the College. No such change shall be entertained once the application for University registration is forwarded to the University from the college.
 - Regarding the relaxation of minimum marks for admission against reserve seats/ quotas for ST/ SC/ PWD/ OBC and other candidates, the guidelines/ instructions of GoI/ UGC issued from time to time will be followed.
 - The study of Skill/ Vocational/ Ability enhancement etc. course shall be guided by the relevant rules and regulations of the UGC issued from time to time and adopted by Bodoland University.

Types and Title /Nomenclature of Qualifications (Degree)

1. **Exit at the first year (Exit-1): UG Certificate**
2. In addition to a minimum of 40 credits earned, the student will require to complete a mandatory work-based vocational course or internship/apprenticeship of 4 credits offered during the summer term. This is in addition to the 6 credits from the skill-based courses earned during the first and second semesters.
3. **Exit at second year (Exit-2): UG Diploma**
4. In addition to a minimum of 80 credits earned, the student will require to complete a mandatory work-based vocational course or internship/apprenticeship of 4 credits offered during the first- year or second-year summer term.
5. **UG Degree (Undergraduate Bachelor Degree):** This degree is awarded in a relevant discipline/subject to those who pursue a 3-year UG programme and secure 120 credits.
6. **UG Degree with Honours:** It will be awarded on securing 160 credits by taking 12 credit advanced level (400 levels) courses instead of a Research Project/ Dissertation.
7. **UG Degree with Honours and Research:** A 4-Year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) will be awarded if the student completes a rigorous research project of 12 credits in the major area (s) of study under the guidance of a faculty member. The students are expected to complete the Research Project in the eighth semester. The research outcomes of their project work may be published in peer-reviewed journals so may be presented in conferences/seminars or may be patented.

Major and Minor disciplines

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline. Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded a B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics. Students willing to pursue UG degrees with two Minors shall have to choose two disciplines as Minor (MIN-A and MIN-B) in the first semester and this shall be continued till 6th semester. Minor A (Min A) shall be the focused area of study and Minor B shall be the additional area of study for the student. The student shall be allowed to provisionally opt to pursue MIN-A (which is the focused area of study of the student) as a Major discipline in the 7th Semester subject to the condition that he/she secures 75 percent marks or more till the 6th Semester with no backlog or betterment or else the admission/seat will be forfeited by the student. Students willing to pursue 4 years UG Degree with a Major and Minor shall choose one discipline as a Major (MAJ) and one additional discipline as a Minor (MIN) in the first semester.

Credit Distribution

1. An individual paper of all discipline-specific courses (major or minor) shall be of 4 credits.
2. Other Courses: Courses under the Multi-disciplinary and Skill Enhancement categories shall be of 3 credits each paper.
3. Ability Enhancement Course (language) shall be of 02 credits for each paper.
4. Courses under Value Added, Community outreach activities, etc., shall be of 04 Credits. The 04 credits value-added courses may be split into two parts. For example, 02 credits for Env. Sc/ Env Ed/Digital and Technology solution and 02 credits for Yoga/Sports/NCC/NSS/Community engagement etc. which equals 4 credits in the category in a semester.
5. Fourth semester Internship/ Apprenticeship shall be of 02 credits.
6. Summer Internship/ Apprenticeship shall be of 04 credits of minimum 8 weeks duration and shall be mandatory for students who decide to exit with UG Certificate/ UG Diploma.
7. Final year Research project/Dissertation to be of 12 credits.
8. Students shall choose one MOOC course from the list of courses offered for SEC, VAC or IDC in a single semester.

*Skill-based courses may be worked out in line with the UGC guidelines under National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF)/ National Credit Framework (NCrF)

**Affiliated Colleges may be allowed to design 2-credit Skill/Add-On/Certificate/Value Added Courses maintaining the levels and difficulty, as per National Credit Framework (accommodating NHEQF and NSQF), from the basket of titles approved by the University. And the titles should be mapped in the Academic Bank of Credit registration. Courses on traditional knowledge systems and local culture may be also formulated under this category.

***Honours students without research will opt for three courses for 12 credits instead of a research project/dissertation. Students who wish to take Honours and research must opt Research Methodology course (REM) in the VII-Semester.

Note:

Interdisciplinary UG programme: Core credits are equally distributed (e.g., among 03 subjects). Multidisciplinary UG programmes may be among life sciences, physical science and other disciplines.



Computation of SGPA and CGPA

The UGC recommended procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be followed as given below:

SGPA:

The ratio of the sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e., $SGPA (S_i) = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$, Where C_i is the number of credits of the i^{th} course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i^{th} course.

CGPA:

The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is also calculated in the same manner taking into

account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme,

i.e., $CGPA = \frac{\sum(C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$

Where S_i is the SGPA of the i^{th} semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

COLLEGE PREMISES AND FACILITIES

Salbari College has an adequate academic and physical infrastructure providing eight subjects for the Arts stream and five subjects for the Science stream in the undergraduate classes. The College campus incorporates the following facilities:

DIGITAL LIBRARY

The library plays a vital role in a Degree College. The society needs library for acquiring better education, both formal and non-formal. The College has a well stocked designed digital library with a large number of books on subjects related to courses taught, in addition to library volumes, ready reference encyclopedia etc. The College subscribes to all major magazines, local and national books and journal and all leading local daily and weekly newspapers. The Library has a separate and spacious Reading Room in which students can put their raw ideas into perspectives, for better learning. The Library has got computer facility and e-library system. The Students are issued library cards for borrowing books subject to library rules. Currently, the College Library is situated with the College main building and going to be shifted in a separate building for better service to students.





COLLEGE PREMISES AND FACILITIES

HOSTEL ACCOMODATION

The College presently runs a hostel for Girls students only with all facilities within the campus. Great care has been kept to make the hostel a home away from home. Nutritious, hygienically prepared food is served. Admission into the hostel is based on merit as the seat capacity is limited. The hostel has a capacity of 80 borders at present. After getting admission into the College, students willing to avail hostel accommodation, may apply to the concerned authority in separate application form available in the college website on payment of Rs.100/- per form. The selected students will have to pay separate admission fees as decided by the Hostel Management Committee. Hostel Borders are expected to be regular in attending classes and must maintain good academic record. They have to follow certain hostel rules, failing which may lead them to be expelled either from the hostel or from the college or from both if the authority feels so.





COLLEGE PREMISES AND FACILITIES

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

There is one unit of NSS consisting of one hundred student volunteers. Our NSS team regularly carry out their community services in the locality.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS(NCC)

A wing of National Cadet Corps under 30 Assam BN NCC has been started in the college since 2020. Theory and practical classes are provided to the cadets inside the college premises. Each year many cadets have cleared "B" and "C" certificate examinations.



AUDITORIUM

The College auditorium is used for holding various competitions during College Youth Festival along with other cultural programmes besides seminars and meetings.

CANTEEN

The College has a well furnished and hygienic canteen for teachers and students in the college campus which provides healthy and nutritious food for refreshments. It usually functions from 9.00am to 6.00 pm in all working days.

COMMON ROOM

The College has provided separate Common rooms for teachers, boys and girls students. The Common Rooms are spacious and provided with up-to-date facilities with attached toilet and running water.

SPORTS FACILITIES

The College has a playground within the campus which is large enough for all outdoor games and for all athletic events. An Indoor Stadium, for holding indoor events, has been setup within the College campus.

COMPUTER LABORATORY

The College has developed a computer Laboratory and a Psychological Lab to provide students with the best exposure and practical training attached to the College main building. Each Lab is furnished with the latest equipments and machinery.

KKHSOU STUDY CENTRE

The College has a study centre of Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU), a popular Open University in the North East that offers BA and MA course in distance mode.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Reserved categories, viz. ST, SC and OBC students are eligible for Govt. of India Scholarships. The admitted students of such categories have to individually apply online at www.scholarsnips.gov.in as per the deadline to be notified in the National Scholarship Portal and leading News Papers from time to time.



PARKING SHED

There are parking sheds for cars, bikes, bicycles of College employees, and as well as for students within the College campus.

UNINTERRUPTED POWER SUPPLY

The college has installed 30 KVA digital generator for uninterrupted power supply funded by UGC and Solar panel of 50kw.





STUDENTS' UNION

There is a Union body of students namely Salbari College Students' Union which is committed to maintain healthy academic atmosphere and other student related works.

The Union conducts Fresher's Social to welcome the newcomer students of the College, hold Annual Youth Festival and celebrates Saraswati Puja and also participates in various literary, cultural and sports events and activities organized in the College and other Colleges as well.

SALBARI SCIENCE CIRCLE

The Salbari Science Circle, the official science club of Salbari College, has been actively fostering scientific curiosity and enthusiasm among students. One of its flagship initiatives, Vigyanutsav, has been successfully organized for the past two years, drawing enthusiastic participation from both college students and students of nearby schools. Through inspiring talks, engaging competitions, and hands-on events, the program aims to ignite scientific temper and motivate the younger generation to explore the wonders of science and innovation.



DIGITAL AND SMART CLASSROOMS

The College has two fully furnished air conditioned smart classroom and sufficient number of digital classrooms. Both the smart classrooms have sitting capacity of 120 people each and the digital classrooms are equipped with 50 seat capacity. The digital cum smart classrooms are assigned to each and every departments.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Registration via SAMARTH portal:

In the larger interest of the students, the Govt. of Assam in Higher Education Department has notified that all UG admissions (four year or five year integrated programmes) for the academic session 2025-26 across State Universities/Autonomous Colleges / Govt/ Provincialized/ PDUAM/ Govt. Model/ Private Colleges will be provisioned through the Assam Higher Education Admission Portal (<https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in>)

The admission portal had opened for registration of student details from **3rd April, 2025** onwards and for giving programme preference after declaration of 12th Board results. The preference for programme of study (BA/B.Sc/B.Com/B.Voc etc) in any discipline of choice will be subject to eligibility defined for admission by the concerned affiliating University/degree awarding Institution and marks obtained in the eligibility examination (12th marks or CUET score) to be considered for admissions through Notification.

As per Govt. of Assam O.M. No. E-268507/1 dated 3rd March, 2023, it was decided to provision the entry of students in 3rd Semester laterally who have done diploma from Polytechnics after Class X to maintain parity as per National Credit Framework and all Higher Educational Institutes are instructed to make provisions for the same.

Admission in college:

The eligible student can avail free admission as per the rules directed by Govt. of Assam. For details the student can contact the College authority as per Govt. rules.

The students seeking admission into the 1st Semester FYUGP must apply online on or before the deadline as notified on college website as per the direction of Director of Higher Education and Govt. of Assam. Students can download the detailed prospectus free of cost which is available on College Website www.salbaricollege.ac.in.

Self attested copies in JPEG/PDF format of the following documents shall have to be uploaded while applying online.

1. Caste Certificate. (if applicable)
2. HSLC Admit Card indicating the Date of Birth along with Marks sheet and Pass Certificate.
3. Registration certificate issued by AHSEC/CBSE along with Mark sheet and Pass Certificate.
4. Two recent passport size photograph.

In addition to the documents enlisted above, 3rd semester and 5th semester students will have to upload JPEG/PDF format of the following documents.

- a. University registration Certificate. (if already received.)
- b. Any previous Grade Sheet whichever is applicable.

5. Applicants have to enroll their names through online at www.salbaricollege.ac.in. The login ID will be their Mobile No and they have to provide a password of their own choice. Details guideline about the login process and setting up of Password can be found in the Admission Portal.

6. After enrolling successfully, the applicants can fill up their required data as per the form by logging in through their login ID and Password.
7. Candidates are advised to keep a print out copy of the filled in form for future reference.
8. Selected Candidates will be sent an Email and an SMS along with an Acknowledgement of Receipt in the Mobile No and Email they have provided while filling up the forms.
9. Admitted students will have to submit the print out copies of Admission Receipt and Admission Forms at the time of Physical Verification of documents. Students will be issued identity cards only after production of Admission Receipt.
10. Helpline nos will be displayed at the homepage of the College Website for any assistance regarding the submission of online forms.
11. Applicants are advised to provide a valid contact number while enrolling online and further they are advised not to change their nos until the end of their study in the College. If the no is changed for some unavoidable reason, they must have to inform the authority immediately and must provide the new no for further communication.
12. After getting admission in this college, students are expected not to get admission in any other college. If they do so, they are advised to inform the authority immediately.

IMPORTANT

Students will have to produce original copies of all relevant documents at the time of physical verification. The date of physical verification will be notified later on.

- Admission is given purely on merit basis subject to BU regulation.
- The qualifying examination is higher secondary or its equivalent (10+2) for FYUGP 1st Semester.

FEES WAIVER SCHEME

Govt. of Assam in Higher Education Department has decided that only certificate issued by the Circle Officer (competent revenue official) will be accepted for the purpose of granting Fee Waiver in admission from the upcoming academic session 2025-26 across all eligible Higher Education Institutions who are eligible for Fee Waiver, as per the relevant O.M.

Besides, free admission will also be provided to the poor but meritorious students of the locality securing at least 75% marks in the last qualifying examination on submission of valid documents viz. income certificates, BPL card etc. Free admission is also available for the candidates showing performance in the field of Arts, Culture, Sports etc. at the State, National or International level.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

The Candidates are selected strictly in order of merit on the qualifying examinations for admission into FYUGP 1st Semester. Merit list will be prepared following the Govt. Reservation system as per norms. The College authority reserves the right to deny admission to any candidate. The merit list will be displayed on the College Notice Board and will be available in the College website www.salbaricollege.ac.in on the scheduled date.

CHECK LIST

- ✓ You have filled in all the fields of the online Application Form.
- ✓ You have noted down your application Form Number for future reference or retained a downloaded copy of the filled in Application Form.
- ✓ Your Application Form is complete in all respects.
- ✓ You have uploaded the recent passport size photograph (JPEG format).
- ✓ You have uploaded JPEG format of your signature in the space provided for signature.
- ✓ You fulfill the eligibility criteria as prescribed by the COLLEGE for the disciplines/field(s) of study you are applying for.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR MAJOR COURSE

A student seeking admission into Major Course must obtain a minimum of 45% marks in the concerned subject in the last Qualifying Examination. Further, He/She will have to secure at least 45% of marks in aggregate in the last qualifying examination as well. The Departments will separately notify the admission procedures for Honours Course as per the intake capacity mentioned above. The decision of the departments is final and binding in terms of the selection of candidates in Honours Course with due approval of the Admission Committee.

ADMISSION FEES

The admission fees notification will be notified later on college website and college notice board. The amount will be decided as per the uniform fees structure given by the DHE, Govt. Of Assam for the academic session 2025-26. Free admission will be provided by the government of Assam for ration card holders. Income certificate issued by respective authority will also valid for fee waiver scheme if the annual family income is below 4Lakhs.

MODE OF PAYMENT

Cashless online Banking payment system only is applicable for any kind of payment.

CODE OF CONDUCT

N.B.- The students are not allowed to enter the College Campus without Uniform during College hours and in functions in the college campus.

RULES AND REGULATION**MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS**

The College lays great emphasis on the discipline and character building among students and they are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline.

- ✓ The students admitted to the College must abide by all rules and regulation as prescribed by the College authority as per UGC and G.U./B.U. norms. Violation of rules, irregular attendance and showing disregards to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination hours are some of the offences which may make the students liable for disciplinary action such as forfeit of scholarship and even expulsion from the College.
- ✓ The Course of study in the college is full time course. So, the students are not allowed to pursue any other course of study simultaneously in another institution.
- ✓ If any student desires to paste or circulate any NOTICE anywhere in the College premises, he/she must seek prior permission and approval of the College authority.
- ✓ The Principal of College maintains all disciplinary action within the College campus and his decision shall be binding in all respects.
- ✓ The College students' union holds FRESHMAN SOCIAL to greet the FRESHERS. The date of FRESHERS' SOCIAL is decided by College Authority in consultation with the students' union.
- ✓ Students are advised to regularly read all notice displayed on the Notice Boards. Ignorance of the same cannot be justified.
- ✓ Students shall attend Lectures, Practical, Tutorials, Sessional Examinations and shall keep their guardians informed of their progress in studies. If any student refrain himself/herself from appearing Sessional Examinations conducted by the College Examination Board, He/She shall be debarred from appearing the Term End/ End Semester Examinations conducted by the University.
- ✓ Students should keep in mind that Smoking, Chewing of Tobacco; Use of DRUGS is strictly prohibited in the College campus.
- ✓ Students must switch off Mobile/Cell Phones in the Classrooms, Laboratory, Library, and Reading Room or during any academic activity.
- ✓ Students are advised to provide a unique contact no. and email ID till the end of the course.
- ✓ At least 75% of attendance in each semester is mandatory for all the students. A poor and irregular attendance of a student may lead him to face disciplinary action by the authority such as Non-Collegiate, Dis-Collegiate etc.
- ✓ The students must bring the identity card to the college everyday so that it can be produced as and when needed by the college authority.
- ✓ Wearing of College Uniform is compulsory for all students during the Class hours, Examinations and other academic activities except some certain festivals as notified by the college authority.
- ✓ Ragging is strictly prohibited in the College. Anyone found involved in ragging shall be dealt with strict punishment to the extent of expulsion from the College as per law.
- ✓ Students must maintain a decorum in the college campus including Library and Reading Room.

ISSUE AND RENEWAL OF COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD

On being admitted, each student is issued a College Identity Card which remains valid only for an academic session. Students should possess their cards along with them during the class hours, in the college event etc. In the event of original card being lost, a duplicate card is issued on payment of Rs. 150/- on being intimidated by the student. Old cards are to be submitted to the college authority at the end of each academic session for renewal.

ATTENDANCE RULE

Students who do not achieve at least 75% of total classes held in an academic session are not allowed to appear in any examination conducted by the College Examination Board. This applies to all the subjects- both Major and Minor Courses.

EXAMINATION RULE

All the Sessional Examinations are conducted by the College Examination Board. The Term End/End Semester Examinations are conducted by the University which is managed by the College Examination Board. The College Examination Board has set up some certain rules for the students.

1. It is mandatory for all students to appear in all examinations conducted by the College Examination Board during an academic year. The minimum attendance of a student must be 75% of the total classes held. Sick bed will be provided to the sick students during all examinations on production of a valid Medical Certificate issued by a Government Medical Officer not below the rank M & H.O.-1.
2. One Sessional Examination per semester as per B.U. rules is conducted by the College Examination Board during an academic year.
3. Students who do not appear in their subjects in any examination are deemed to have secured zero in the particular subject.
4. Result of defaulter on account of College, Sports, Students Union, Library matters etc. is kept withheld.
5. Re-admission of unsuccessful students is governed by College Admission rules.
6. If any student is found adopting unfair means in any examination, he/she is liable to the extent of expulsion from the examination hall.
7. Students must attend all the Sessional Examinations conducted by the College Examination Board failing which he/she shall be debarred from appearing in Semester Examinations of B.U.

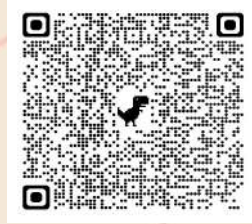
