- ❖ **Language:** Participants may submit their paper in Bodo, Assamese, Bengali, Hindi and English.
- ❖ **Length of the Abstract/Paper:** The abstract of the paper should be within 250 words and the length of the full paper should be within 2,500 to 3,000 words.
